**Getting Ready for High School (\$250)**

A one-week program developed for Grade 8's ready to begin Grade 9. Typically run in August, it addresses preparation skills in the areas of Mathematics and English and provides strategies in general Study Skills. (Can be delivered under Literacy and Numeracy funding models – Grades 7 – 10)

**Senior Associated Curriculum (\$500)**

A 250 page document that provides teachers with resources for developmentally delayed adolescent students.

**Credit Recovery Curriculum (\$250)**

A guideline for credit recovery programs that utilizes a combination of ILC products and our own locally developed courses to assist students to credit recovery (following the remedial summer school models). Last updated Jan. 2008 – next update – Fall 2008.
